4 Contents

- The participants have been informed about the GGF Intellectual Property, the sign-up sheet circulated.
- Presentation and discussion of the charter
 - The list of documents to be produced has to be added to the milestones (action, WG co-chairs).
 - It has been clearly stated that the focus of the GSO-WG is NOT to produce a Grid resource ontology, but a scheduling ontology.
- Discussion
 - Question: In which context will the Grid scheduling architecture be used? Answer: Potential users are a EC funded project (still in negotiations), the GRAAP-WG and the JSDL group.
 - Question: Does the Semantic Grid Research Group (SEM-RG) provide a framework for the Grid Scheduling Ontology? Answer: No, the GSO-WG is defining a domain specific ontology which may serve as a “showcase” for the SEM-RG.
 - Question: Has contact been established between the GSO-WG and the Grid Information Retrieval Working Group (GIR-WG).? Answer: Not yet, to be done (action, WG co-chairs).
 - Question: What is the relationship to the Job Specification Definition Language Working Group (JSDL-WG)? Answer (Ali Anjomshoaa, JSDL-WG co-chair): JSDL is not specifying scheduling requirements, but wishes the GSO-WG to do so.
- The question whether session attendees are willing to commit to work a certain amount of time weekly to reach the group’s milestones have been answered positively by three persons.
